

CENSIS IoT Cyber Challenge: Rules

1. Eligibility

- a. The programme is open to companies or individuals with an IoT Cyber Security or Resilience product or service offering to accelerate into the market.
- b. Companies who apply for the CENSIS IoT Cyber Challenge Accelerator must have an operational base in Scotland at which the proposal will be developed.

2. Competition Entry Information

- a. The promoter is the University Court of the University of Glasgow, a charity registered in Scotland under charity registration number SC004401, having its principal offices at University Avenue, Glasgow, G12 8QQ, acting through CENSIS, Inovo Building, 121 George Street, G1 1RD.
- b. The competition will be delivered by CENSIS, the Innovation Centre for Sensor and Imaging Systems.
- c. There is no entry fee to enter this competition.
- d. Route to entry for the competition and details of how to enter are via https://censis.org.uk/2020/04/20/censis-iot-cyber-challenge-accelerator-2020/
- e. Entries can be made at any time until the closing date.
- f. The closing date for entry is Friday 29th May 2020. After this date no further entries to the competition will be permitted.
- g. Up to five award recipients will be provided CENSIS support
- h. Award recipients will be notified on or before Friday 12th June 2017.
- i. Award recipients may send a maximum of two participants for CENSIS support.
- j. CENSIS support is for 10 non-consecutive days remote support or, where possible, at the offices of CENSIS. No alternative site will be available. Award recipients will be expected to cover the travel (and if necessary accommodation) costs of their employees obtaining support. Support shall be provided at mutually agreed times, subject to the availability of CENSIS resources and used within six months of being notified as a award recipient. Failure of a award recipient to use all / part of the support within the six month period shall not entitle the award recipient to support after the six month period has elapsed or for any services or remuneration in lieu. Award recipients will be expected to pay for any materials that are required for the CENSIS support. These material costs will be agreed in advance by both CENSIS and the award recipient.
- k. The support offered to award recipients is De Minimis aid (EC Regulation No 1407/2013) with total value of £7000. Entrants should ensure that if they win the competition, they will not exceed their De Minimis aid allowance.

- I. No responsibility can be accepted for entries not received for whatever reason.

- n. The promoter reserves the right to cancel or amend the competition and these terms and conditions without notice including in the event of matters arising outside of the promoter's control, which may include, but not be limited to matters relating to any current or ongoing health emergency. Any changes to the competition will be notified to entrants as soon as possible by the promoter.
- o. The promoter is not responsible for inaccurate prize details supplied to any entrant by any third party connected with this competition.
- p. No cash alternative to the prizes will be offered. The prizes are not transferable.
 Prizes are subject to availability and we reserve the right to substitute any prize with another of equivalent value without giving notice.
- q. Award recipients will be chosen by a review panel selected by the promotor. Application entries may be shared with Scottish Enterprise and the Scottish Government who are sponsoring the competition.
- r. The promoter's decision in respect of all matters to do with the competition will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- s. By entering this competition, an entrant is indicating his/her agreement to be bound by these terms and conditions. Award recipients will also be required to sign a contract with the promoter. A copy of this is available on request.
- t. The competition and these terms and conditions including those referenced herein will be governed by Scots law and any disputes will be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Scotland.
- u. The award recipient agrees to the use of his/her name and image in any publicity material associated with the competition and agrees to provide the promoter with a non-confidential summary of the project which can be placed on the promoter's website.
- v. The award recipient agrees for CENSIS to provide Scottish Enterprise and the Scottish Government, the following:
 - the information provided in the 'Company Details' of their application form
 - expected outcomes within three years, following the completion of the accelerator support

- x. Entry into the competition will be deemed as acceptance of these terms and conditions.

3. Intellectual Property and Confidentiality

- a. Applications to the accelerator will be treated as confidential and support provided to the award recipients on a confidential basis, with the exception for points 'q.' 'u.', and 'v.' in section 2.
